

5. We should assemble together in the Name of Jesus.

“For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them” (Matthew 18:20).

6. We should speak and teach in the Name of Jesus.

“And they called them, and commanded them not to speak at all nor teach in the name of Jesus” (Acts 4:18).

7. We may preach in the Name of Jesus.

“But Barnabas took him, and brought him to the apostles, and declared unto them how he had seen the Lord in the way, and that he had spoken to him, and how he had preached boldly at Damascus in the name of Jesus” (Acts 9:27).

“And that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name among all nations, beginning at Jerusalem” (Luke 24:47).

8. We should receive others in the Name of Jesus.

“And whoso shall receive one such little child in my name receiveth me” (Matthew 18:5).

9. We should serve others in the Name of Jesus.

“For whosoever shall give you a cup of water to drink in my name, because ye belong to Christ, verily I say unto you, he shall not lose his reward” (Mark 9:41).

10. We can pray and ASK in the Name of Jesus.

“And in that day ye shall ask me nothing. Verily, verily, I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it you. Hitherto have ye asked nothing in my name: ask, and ye shall receive, that your joy may be full” (John 16:24)

12. We can command healing in the Name of Jesus.

“Then Peter said, Silver and gold have I none; but such as I have give I thee: In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth rise up and walk” (Acts 3:6).

12. We may receive healing in the Name of Jesus.

“And his name through faith in his name hath made this man strong, whom ye see and know: yea, the faith which is by him hath given him this perfect soundness in the presence of you all” (Acts 3:16) (The lame man, who could not walk).

13. We can cast out evil spirits in the Name of Jesus.

“And this did she many days. But Paul, being grieved, turned and said to the spirit, I command thee in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her. And he came out the same hour” (Acts 16:18).

14. We can do miracles in the Name of Jesus.

“And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover” (Mark 16:17-18).

15. We can do the works of Jesus in the Name of Jesus and even greater works.

“Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father.” (John 14:12).

In The Name of

JESUS

What is the meaning of “in the name of Jesus”?

The Greek word for JESUS is Ἰησοῦς (Iēsous). The Hebrew is “*Jehoshua*”, יֵשׁוּעַ. It is basically the same as the Hebrew word for Joshua meaning Jehovah saves. It is combination of: Jehovah (meaning the “I AM”) + Hosea (meaning “savior”). (Matthew 1:21).

John declares that Jesus is God by proving that he is the "I AM" in the book of John.

John 4:24-26 = the Messiah

John 6:35 = the bread of life

John 8:12 = the light of the world

John 8:24 = “the I Am”

John 8:58 = “the I Am.”

John 9:5 = the light of the world.

John 10:27 = the door to the sheep fold

John 10:11 = the good shepherd

John 10:36 = the Son of God

John 11:25 = the resurrection and the life

John 12:26 = a light come into the world

John 13:13 = Master and Lord

John 14:6 = the way, the truth, and the life

John 15:1 = the true vine

John 18:6 = “the I Am”

John 18:37 = a king / King of kings (Revelation 17:14).

NAME: represents the "origin" of the person.

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God” (John 1:1). He is the Word and he is God.

NAME: represents the "nature" the person.

Jesus is the God-man. Fully God and fully man.

“And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory” (I Timothy 3:16). He is God.

“Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men” (Philippians 2:7).

“For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one” (I John 5:7). Thus he is part of the trinity.

“For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily” (Colossians 2:9).

NAME: represents the "character" of the person.

“And yet if I judge, my judgment is true: for I am not alone, but I and the Father that sent me” (John 8:16).

NAME: represents the "mission" of the person.

“For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost” (Luke 19:10).

NAME: represents the "authority" of the individual. (exousia).

“And they were astonished at his doctrine: for he taught them as one that had authority, and not as the scribes” (Mark 1:22).

“And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power (authority) is given unto me in heaven and in earth” (Matthew 28:18).

NAME: represents the "power" of the

individual. (dunamis).

“And Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit into Galilee: and there went out a fame of him through all the region round about” (Luke 4:14)

“Behold, I give unto you power to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power (power) of the enemy: and nothing shall by any means hurt you” (Luke 10:19).

NAME: represents the "work" of the individual.

“How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him” (Acts 10:38).

NAME: represent the "reputation" of the person.

“Pilate therefore went forth again, and saith unto them, Behold, I bring him forth to you, that ye may know that I find no fault in him” (John 19:4).

NAME: represents the "knowledge" and “wisdom.”

“I wisdom dwell with prudence, and find out knowledge of witty inventions” (Proverbs 8:12).

NAME: represents the "dominion" of the individual. (Sovereign control)

"Area" = “For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him” (Colossians 1:16).

"Length of time"="I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the

Almighty” (Revelation 1:8).

NAME: represents amount of "worthiness".

“Saying with a loud voice, Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing” (Revelation 5:12).

We are to surrender our lives to Jesus as Lord, become his ambassadors, and use the Name of Jesus.

1. We should believe in the Name of Jesus.

“Now when he was in Jerusalem at the passover, in the feast day, many believed in his name, when they saw the miracles which he did” (John 2:23).

2. We are to call upon the Name of Jesus.

“For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved” (Romans 10:13).

3. We are to confess the Name of Jesus, letting him be our Lord.

“That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved” (Romans 10:9).

“Also I say unto you, Whosoever shall confess me before men, him shall the Son of man also confess before the angels of God” (Luke 12:8).

4. We are commanded to be baptized in the Name of Jesus.

“Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost” (Acts 2:38).
